The end to another year is here, the time when we share the abundant love of St. Peter's with others in our community through Thanksgiving, Christmas, and our end-of-year benevolence distributions. As I write, it is a bit early to have definite plans in place, but here is what I have so far:

Thanksgiving: Donations needed by November 24.

- Plymouth Crossroads: They would like to know what we are willing to do. Last year, we were able to provide a cooked and sliced turkey with stuffing and gravy, mashed potatoes, green bean salad, pies and beverages. It would be great if we could do that again, but they can find additional items from other church groups, if needed.
- I currently have four additional families on the list.
 One of them has requested a 10-12 pound turkey.
 More may be added.

Christmas Giving Tree: Donations needed by Dec. 18.

- Plymouth Crossroads: They will probably have 8-10 names for us this year. They don't have plans yet for Christmas dinner, but will gladly take desserts, pop, chips, dip, etc.
- There are currently two other families on the list.
 More may be added.

I have also reached out to Kevin Guest House, which was one of our Mission Moments earlier this year. I will let you know if they have any requests. Information will be sent out through e-mail and announced in church as more details are put in place. PLEASE LET ME KNOW if you are aware of any other needs in our community.








Volunteers are needed to help decorate the Sanctary on Sunday, December 1, right after the Budget Meeting. All are welcome to volunteer.


